



180 CLUB Attention Getters

It is important to get all of your students' attention before attempting to give instructions or start a lesson. Make sure you have everyone listening with their eyes and ears before talking.

“If you can hear me....pat your head...touch your ears...”

Other examples – you may have to teach and practice once before using

Teacher

1, 2, 3 Eyes on Me!

Holy Moly!

All Set!

Hands on Top

Ready to Rock

Macaroni and Cheese

SH! SH! SH, SH, SH!

Clap! Clap! Clap, Clap, Clap

Student

1, 2, Eyes on you!

Clap! Clap!, Clap, Clap, Clap

Connecting consistently with your kids

Have kids rate their day 1-5 using their fingers with 1 being the worst day ever to 5 being a wonderful day. Say, “Show me on your hands how your day went from 1 to 5 on the count of three. 1, 2, 3, go!” Have all the kids raise their hand at the same time. Make sure you explain the number rating system first and participate yourself.

- Let a couple kids share about what made their day that number.
